3	Learning Outcomes Course Description: This course is designed to provide students with theoretical and practical knowledge about issues of life in China, and reflect on issues of the relationship of Chinese society in the life of Indonesian society. By understanding these issues, students are expected to be able to see the reality of Chinese society more deeply through the study of articles/papers/scientific papers. As a project-base course, assessments in this course include attendance, project base, participation in class, task, quiz, mid-test, and final test.
